Seaside tack attacks on mobility scooters

TACKS have been scattered on pavements in a seaside town in an apparent vendetta against mobility scooter drivers.

Residents say that pensioners have had to dodge roof tacks thrown around the streets of Clacton-on-sea, Essex, which has one of the highest number of mobility scooter users in the UK.

A repairman has spoken about the disturbing rise in tyres being punctured by tacks after seeing 15 cases in just two weeks. Roger Ball, 67, of Easy Mobility Services, said he was running out of tubes of the particular

size needed to fix tyres.

Mr Ball said there had been a "suspicious" surge in the number of scooters punctured by the same type of tacks. He said he had been called out by one woman from Jaywick whose wheels were punctured three times in four days.

Barry O'connell, 71, a disability campaigner, said he suspects people are dropping the nails on purpose to get the electric scooters off the roads.

He said: "Someone's getting back at mobility scooter users, and the problem is how they're driven."

He added that drivers had a bad

reputation as they hit people and don't claim responsibility.
